# Curriculum

## Junior Cycle Curriculum

**Core Subjects:** English, Irish, Maths, Science, History, Geography, CSPE, Religious Education, PE, SPHE

**In addition** all pupils take programmes in Music, Computing, Social Skills, Choir and School Sport.

Each pupil must also choose three subjects from French, Spanish, Home Economics, Art, Technical Graphics, Business, German, Materials Technology Wood, Business, Music, Art, Home Economics, Materials Technology Wood.

## Transition Year

This is an innovative, exciting curriculum helping the pupils develop from junior cycle, where they have little choice in what they study or how they learn, to becoming self directed learners taking more personal responsibility in all aspects of life. It is a holistic programme offering opportunities to

- Sample all of the senior cycle subject options
- Take on new challenges in ICT, projects, drama, debating, music, sport, leadership etc
- Enter for the challenges of the President's Award Scheme – Gaisce
- Undertake personal development and build confidence in the peer group – Cappanalea Outdoor Pursuits and the Skiing Tour
- Learn to plan and manage events – begin to take on leadership roles
- Develop a Young Scientist project, Business project, Green Schools Environmental project etc
- Learn lifeskills from the Driver Theory test to First Aid, charity work to understanding politics
- Engage with speakers on numerous topics
- Take on two work experience placements
- Build up a great team spirit with classmates to sustain on through senior cycle

# Boarding

## Roundhill House

Roundhill is the Boys boarding house. The boys boarding area is run by Housemaster, Mr. Bartley.

Roundhill is currently home to 63 boys who opt for 5 day or 7 day boarding.

The house is divided into a junior section which houses forms 1-3 and a senior section which houses forms 4-6.

Each section has a number of individual rooms which accommodates 3,4,5 students depending on size.

Each dormitory has a single bed, bedside locker, drawers and lockers for each student.

The house also has a student kitchen which has tea/coffee making facilities, a microwave oven, a sandwich maker & TV/DVD with full Sky package.

There are also washing machines, tumble dryers and a drying room for boarders along with a large shower area with individual private cubicles.

The school prides itself on creating a safe, warm, homely atmosphere in the boarding house and this is reflected by the demand in boarding numbers each year.

## Richmount House

There are 60 girls boarding places available each year in Richmount House. Form 1 and 2 students have their dorms in the north wing while students in Forms 3- 6 are in the south wing with Form 5 & 6 in smaller 4 bed dorms. Both wings have their own TV room with kitchenette and dining space and in the senior wing there are laundry facilities which include washing machines, tumble dryers and a large drying area.

A Housemistress looks after the boarder girls and many female members of staff are involved in staying on site for night duty once a week. There is also a matron on duty each night in case of any emergencies.

Each term the boarder girls have an event to look forward to such as carol singing, DVD night or Katie's Chocolate evening. The Boarders Christmas dinner in December and the Annual Boarder BBQ in May are highlights of the year for both the boarder boys and girls.

Activities Coordinator Audrey O Riordan, who is also a matron in the school, organises Saturday morning activities which range from Archery to Hillwalking and Art to Golf. After lunch on Saturdays and on Sundays there are a range of different options available to 7 day boarders such as table tennis, indoor soccer, computer room, study time or trips into Bandon or Cork.

Finally, Each term the 7 day boarders set off to see some of the best sights Ireland has to offer such as the Cliffs of Moher, the Lakes of Killarney, Dublin City and Ailwee Caves in Co. Clare.

## **Extra Curricular Activities**

### **Rugby**

Rugby is played by boys only in Bandon Grammar.  
As many Boys as possible to take part and all levels are catered for.  
Training takes place Mondays and Thursdays from 4:15 – 5:15/5:30

### **Hockey**

Hockey is played by both girls and boys in Bandon Grammar School.  
Training takes place on Monday and Thursday for girls from 4:15 – 5:15/5:30 and Tuesday and Friday for boys from 4:15 – 5:15/5:3

### **Athletics**

Athletics is a huge part of life in Bandon Grammar School. All pupils are encouraged to partake in the various disciplines and events that take place throughout the year.  
From Cross Country to Track and Field there is a wealth of options for any Athlete!  
The school takes part in West Cork and Munster Cross Country.

### **Basketball**

Basketball is provided for Girls only

### **Chess**

Chess is provided for all students in Bandon Grammar School. The team has an extremely impressive record in competition. New players are always welcome

### **GAA**

Gaelic Football is provided for boys in Summer Term.  
The school competes in the Lord Mayor's Cup tournament which is held in Parc Ui Rinn, Cork. The school secured back to back titles in the years 2009, 2010

### **Tennis**

Tennis is provided for all students in the Summer term in Bandon Grammar.  
They have 3 all weather, floodlit tennis courts.

### **Table Tennis**

Bandon Grammar School Table Tennis is for both boys and girls and for all levels.

### **Badminton**

Badminton is extremely popular in Bandon Grammar School. In addition to playing, training and competing they have trips to watch International games occasionally.

### **Debating**

The School takes part in the Concern Debating Competition annually.  
The team is made up of senior students.
