First class facilities

Celebrating our 40th anniversary, Rathdown School has benefitted from an extensive on-going investment programme, with superb facilities for all our students.

Music is embedded in our culture with regular musical performances. Our purpose-built Music Centre with its auditorium, music technology lab and soundproof practice rooms offers state-of-the-art facilities and the option of one-to-one tuition in virtually every musical instrument.

Information and Communication Technology (ICT) is at the heart of modern education and our students benefit from the way ICT is central to the teaching methodology. The school has modern computer rooms and a Design & Communications Graphics laboratory, and iPads are extensively used in the classroom. The Library is run by a full time dedicated Librarian, and offers a wide range of ICT facilities.

Sport is a key aspect of school life. We offer a wide range of sports, of which hockey, tennis, athletics, basketball and cricket are but a few. A fully-equipped sports hall, astroturf floodlit hockey, tennis courts, 200m running track and a tartan cricket crease are among the range of facilities. There are also activities focusing on health and fitness, such as dance classes, pilates and yoga.

The boarding experience

Living together with their classmates in a warm, friendly and welcoming environment is what makes the boarding experience the heart of an international student's stay at Rathdown. Fellow students become family and Rathdown becomes a 'home-away-from-home'.

We have two boarding houses: Hillcourt House and Innismore House. Under the supervision of our Head of Boarding Ms. Frieda Burke – the students share their living spaces and leisure activities, learn about each other's cultures and make friends they will keep for evermore.

They also have the assistance and support of our International Co-ordinator, Madame Laval. Appointed in 2010, Mme. Laval acts as a full-time liaison between the girls and their parents and guardians to ensure that their experience in Rathdown School is free from stress or worries and she is contactable by email at any time to deal with any individual concerns. In addition, as all students are fully integrated into the school curriculum, friendships will also be formed with day students, and our international students are encouraged to visit and stay with their Irish friends where appropriate.







Life experiences

A great reason for choosing Rathdown as a location for study is the extensive opportunities this offers for getting to know the history, culture and traditions of another country. Our international students make Irish friends and immerse themselves in day-to-day life while our tailored programme offers many opportunities to ensure that our students' memories of Ireland will remain with them for evermore.

We offer a range of modules on aspects of Irish culture to ensure our international students learn about the richness of Irish history, folklore, traditions, music, landscape, food ... every aspect of what it means to live in Ireland. We encourage them to explore issues of cultural diversity by comparing their own cultures with that of Ireland and sharing their knowledge and experiences with their Irish friends.

Outside the curriculum, we organise trips to various local locations. Many of these are regular school trips open to entire classes where all students – national and international – have the opportunity to experience and learn about aspects of Irish culture and history. Every year our International Co-ordinator organises four weekend breaks for the international students where they can fully experience the variety of Irish culture.

Educational opportunities

Rathdown School has been consistently ranked as one of the top secondary schools in Ireland and provides an outstanding core and modular academic programme.

We offer a wide range of subjects, with a particular focus on languages and sciences.*

International students are fully integrated into the national curriculum set out by the Irish Department of Education and Skills for the majority of their timetable, following the same subjects, sitting the same classes, completing the same homework and tests and – where appropriate – sitting national exams at Junior and/or Leaving Certificate level (equivalent to GCSE and A-level respectively).

In addition, specifically-designed modules are provided to address particular needs and requirements, whether in language learning, cultural studies or wherever we perceive there to be a need for additional support or an opportunity to further enhance the students' experience.

*The full list of subjects currently available is as follows (please note that this is subject to change): Languages: English, Irish, French, German, Spanish. Sciences: Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Applied Mathematics, Agricultural Science.

Other subjects: History, Geography, Art, Music, Business, Accounting, Economics, Home Economics, Design & Communication Graphics, Physical Education, Religion, CSPE (Civic, Social & Political Education), SPHE (Social, Personal & Health Education). Extra academic modules

Integration into the regular curriculum is a priority for all our international students but we also recognise that they have specific needs and interests distinct from their Irish counterparts. In addition to having a personal tutor to monitor their academic and social needs, they have access to a range of tailor-made additional classes, activities and courses.

English Acquisition and Reinforcement
